CONTEXT RICH DIVERSITY IN CLOSE PROXIMITY

Economic Outlook

- Wealthiest and poorest nations (GDP)
- Individual wealth concentration
- Stark gap between women and men labor force participation (21% and 77%)

Gender Equality & SDG Progress

- Major advancements in labor law, less in family law
- Highest and lowest figures
 for women's political
 participation found within
 the region
- High levels of women's education, yet low level of labor force participation

Humanitarian Needs and Crises

- Most arid, water scarce, heat and drought prone among world regions
- Vast humanitarian needs: 55 million people
- Windows for transition from humanitarian to development

Opportunities For Speedy Economic Growth

- Increased intraregional trade
- Capitalization on renewable energy
- Taxation models for increased social services
- Surging women's labor force participation

SCALE AND SPEED NATIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH UN WOMEN

Egypt Financial Inclusion

160,000 women enabled to open bank accounts, access personal savings and microloans, increase their financial and digital literacy and increased savings (3-4 times) Jordan OASIS Humanitarian

70,000 women (Syrian refugees and Jordanian host communities) accessed protection services, cash assistance, job placements combined with child care services Morocco Gender Responsive Budgeting

GRB introduced in 2002 → Centre of Excellence 2012, adoption of revised Organic Finance Law in 2015, linking national budget expenditure with gender outcome that are reported yearly



SCALE AND SPEED REGIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH UN WOMEN

Regional LEAP: Syria, Egypt, Iraq, Lebanon & Jordan

100,000

Women reached through a multi-disciplinary service package in 4 countries, including protection services, cash assistance, job placements, and entrepreneurial support Men and Women for Gender Equality

96,000

People reached following a 24 months of positive role modelling, a baseline of 62% of men and women with negative attitudes on gender equality, decreased to 42% **Decent Work for Women**

520 PRIVATE SECTOR Companies

signed the Women Empowerment Principles (WEPs) : a 400% increase since 2019


